Option 1: Down the Drain (Meeting Room A)

Come to this informative session to learn methods that can reduce costly sewer line maintenance caused by fats, oils, and grease put down the drain, tree roots, and more. There will be discussion on preventative maintenance you can start doing now to help stop problems from occurring in the future. Speakers include Rod Chevrus and Jennifer Myatt from LFUCG.

Option 2: Porous Pavers (Meeting Room B)

With the new Water Quality Management fee in effect, learn how porous pavers can help reduce the amount of stormwater that runs off your property and create an appealing look to your parking lot, sidewalks, and more! A representative from Reading Rock Inc. in Cincinnati will speak on this topic.

Option 3: Environmentally-Friendly Landscaping (Meeting Room C)

Learn all the right questions to ask your landscaping company to improve the environment and your wallet! Jaime Dockery, the Fayette County extension agent for Horticulture will be the speaker.

Option 1: Waste Reduction (Meeting Room A)

Learn about ways your business or apartment can reduce the amount of waste you send to the landfill. Esther Moberly with Bluegrass PRIDE will discuss reducing, reusing and the WasteBuster recycling program and Barry Prater with Central Kentucky Fibers will explain other options available for recycling large quantities of materials, such as cardboard.

Option 2: Porous Asphalt (Meeting Room B)

To follow up the porous pavers session, this session will have information on porous asphalt. This material can be used in parking lots and other areas of your property to reduce stormwater run-off. A representative from PAIKY (Plantmix Asphalt Industry of Kentucky) will be speaking.

Option 3: Water Conservation (Meeting Room C)

Ray Golden, with Kentucky American Water, will be talking about water conservation practices you can implement at your business and apartment complex to save money on your water bill and be more conscious of how much water you use every day.

Session C 10:25 – 10:55

Option 1: Litter (Meeting Room A)

Litter is a main source of stormwater pollution. When litter gets picked up by rainwater run-off, it gets carried into local streams, creeks, and rivers. Learn how your business or apartment complex can make a difference by stopping litterers, reporting illegal dumping, volunteering to have a litter clean-up and other practices that can help reduce litter in Lexington.

Option 2: Green Roofs & Rainwater harvesting (Meeting Room B)

CDP, a local engineering firm, has worked on many projects here in Lexington and surrounding areas related to stormwater management and water-quality such as the Georgetown Fire Department. During this session, they will talk about green roofing structures and ways to harvest the rainwater on your property.

Option 3: Other Waste (Meeting Room C)

Other waste can include electronics, household hazardous materials, tires, appliances and more. What do you do with them? Global Environmental Services will talk about electronics recycling and Habitat for Humanity Re-Store will discuss ways to get rid of large household items instead of throwing them away.

Session D 11:00 – 11:30

Option 1: Porous Concrete (Meeting Room A)

For the last porous surface session of the day, a representative from Kentucky Concrete Pavement Association will be speaking about the benefits of installing porous concrete at your property. This material can also be used for parking lots, sidewalks, and more at your property.

Option 2: Incentives (Meeting Room B)

LFUCG will be offering an incentives program to help offset the cost of projects aimed at helping reduce stormwater pollution. These projects, in turn, can help reduce your monthly Water Quality Management Fee.
